DISASTER PLANNING

Are you and your horse ready for wildfire season or other emergencies? VPR is proud to sponsor a disaster planning workshop specifically geared to horse owners on August 3rd at the clubhouse. First responders and animal welfare experts will answer your questions and give essential guidance to help you prepare. Using planning tools provided, participants will develop their own equine evacuation plans, assisted by experts. See examples of other people's plans and tools and purchase equine identification and other key equipment to help you prepare. Panelists include:

- Deputy Jim Davidson, Valley Center Fire Protection District
- Cal Fire
- Sheriff's Department, Fallbrook Substation
- Amy Bilburg, Director of Operations, Del Mar Evacuation Center and Showgrounds

A demonstration on how to load a difficult/panicked horse will be given, and a microchip clinic will be held. Note: if you can't attend the morning sessions, you can still bring your horse for microchipping!


VPR proudly presents a V6 Ranch Campout on September 5 - 8, 2019


